

## LEGAL AID SOCIETY - IRSJ IMMIGRATION TEAM SUMMER 2025 INTERNSHIP

The Individual Rights & Social Justice Practice Immigration team at Legal Aid Society is seeking law student candidates for Summer 2025. Fluency in Spanish is preferred, but not required. The internship is a full-time, unpaid position, though applicants are encouraged to seek external funding, work-study funding, or class credits. LAS summer internships begin the week of May 26, 2025 and continue through early/mid-August. The position is based in Chicago and will by hybrid, with in-person and work from home opportunities

The Individual Rights & Social Justice Practice Group at LAS works to ensure victims of crime have access to a full array of legal and social services. The IR & SJ Practice Group primarily works with survivors of human trafficking, immigrant victims of crime, and individuals with certain employment-related legal concerns. This multi-disciplinary practice group engages in significant community outreach efforts and strives to ensure clients receive trauma informed services that address all of their needs, either through in-house services or by providing referrals to community partners.

## **RESPONSIBILITIES**

- 1. Assist in completing immigration forms and applications;
- 2. Participate with attorneys in client interviews;
- 3. Research case law and procedure for effective client representation;
- 4. Identify and analyze legal problems and solutions relevant to immigration, human trafficking, and crime victim rights representation;
