

## **LEGAL AID SOCIETY - IRSJ LABOR EXPLOITATION TEAM SUMMER 2025 INTERNSHIP**

The IRSJ Labor Exploitation Team at Legal Aid Society is seeking a law student intern for Summer 2025, to assist with employment law and civil litigation related work. This is a full-time, unpaid position, though applicants are encouraged to seek external funding, work-study funding, or class credits. LAS summer internships begin the week of May 26, 2025 and continue through early/mid-August. The position is based in Chicago and will by hybrid, with in-person and work from home opportunities. The intern must be available to work in-person 2-3 days/week at our Downtown Chicago office.

The IRSJ Practice Group works to ensure victims of crime have access to a full array of legal and social services. The group works primarily with survivors of human trafficking, immigrant victims of crime, and individuals with certain employment-related legal concerns. This multi-disciplinary practice group engages in significant community outreach efforts and strives to ensure clients receive trauma informed services that address all of their needs, either through in-house services or by providing referrals to community partners. This position will be primarily working on issues related to employment law, including: wage theft, minimum wage violations, workplace discrimination and harassment, human trafficking and labor exploitation.

## **RESPONSIBILITIES**

- 1. Assist in drafting documents, including pleadings and motions, to be used in administrative proceedings and litigation;
- 2. Participate with attorneys in client interviews;
- 3. Research case law and procedure for effective client representation;
- 4. Identify and analyze legal problems and solutions relevant to wage and hour laws, human trafficking, and civil rights representation;
- 5. Maintain client files; and
- 6. Work effectively with staff and a diverse client population.

## **QUALIFICATIONS**

The ideal candidate will possess the following attributes:

- 1. Strong research and writing skills;
- 2. Interest in litigation and administrative law;
- 3. The ability to communicate effectively with attorneys, clients, and co-workers;
- 4. Strong organizational skills and attention to detail;
- 5. Ability to work effectively on individual assignments and as part of a team;
- 6. Patience and professionalism while working diverse clients; and
- 7. A willingness to ask guestions and seek to clarify assignments and responsibilities.

1. Spanish language fluency.
